As the Summer Camp 2010 comes to a close, I wish to share a few thoughts with you. As you may have realized by now, KAUSHALYA SUMMER CAMP is a little different from the run-of-the-mill ones.

All children are born with abilities. It is with the development of the brain that their abilities convert into skills. It is then that hearing becomes listening, seeing becomes observation, reading evolves into comprehension and speaking into communication. It is amazing to know that over a hundred vital skills can be developed in children in the early childhood. Kaushalya summer camp is all about developing the brains of the little ones to make them more skillful. As the Bhagwat Gita says "Yogaha Karmasu Kaushalam" – meaning Yoga is skill in action, thereby achieving highest excellence in performance. The very name our school is derived from this philosophy.

The scientific process of brain development is based on the Nobel prize winning theory of Roger Sperry – the "Whole Brain Theory". We have activities based on logic, reasoning, analysis and planning to activate the left hemisphere of the brain, and also activities based on emotions, music, poetry, dance, pranayams and meditation to activate the right hemisphere of the brain.
